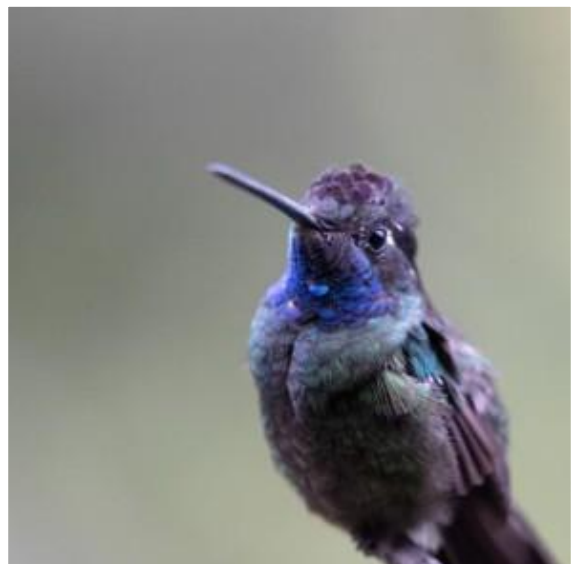

Saturday 25 April 2026

Day 1:

First Day in Paradise / Bougainvillaea Hotel

During a short drive, we were able to see some coffee plantations before arriving at the Bougainvillaea Hotel. After settling down, our group enjoyed a delicious dinner in the hotel restaurant and went through all questions and instructions for the beginning of our wonderful adventure the next morning.

Sunday 26 April 2026

Day 2:

Travelling to the Caribbean / Tortuguero

We travelled by boat through the canals of Tortuguero on a beautiful sunny morning. Wildlife was everywhere. We enjoyed great views of spectacled caiman, emerald basilisk, green and rufous kingfishers along the water's edge. Several blue morpho butterflies floated above the forest, and we were delighted to find a brown-throated three-toed sloth resting in a Cecropia tree during breakfast. In the afternoon we visited the small town of Tortuguero and enjoyed its relaxed Caribbean atmosphere before returning to the lodge for dinner.

Monday 27 April 2026

Day 3:

Caño Palma / Tortuguero

We enjoyed an early morning walk around the hotel grounds in pleasant weather. The forest was active from the start of the day. A slaty-tailed trogon showed well beside the trail, while several keel-billed toucans moved through the canopy above us. A troop of mantled howler monkeys travelled through the trees near the lodge and gave excellent views. Several giant green iguanas were also seen basking around the gardens. In the afternoon we explored the waterways near Caño Palma Biological Station, where wildlife viewing remained very productive. Several white-faced capuchins were seen foraging along the canal edges, and a merlin perched briefly above the wetland before flying across the water. The highlight of the excursion was a bare-throated tiger heron feeding its chick beside the canal.

Tuesday 28 April 2026

Day 4:

Cerro Tortuguero / Tortuguero

We enjoyed an early morning boat excursion through the canals of Tortuguero National Park in calm, sunny conditions. Wildlife was excellent, with spectacled caiman seen along the banks and scarlet macaw flying over the forest. The highlight was a brown-throated three-toed sloth with a newborn young, giving superb views by the water. After breakfast and time at the pool, we visited Cerro Tortuguero in the afternoon. Here we enjoyed wide views and our first spider monkey as a small group moved through the canopy. After dark, a night walk around the lodge produced red-eyed leaf frog, red-webbed tree frog and several toads, with a kinkajou seen moving through the trees above the gardens.

Wednesday 29 April 2026

Day 5:

San Gerardo De Dota

Our day began with a scenic flight from Tortuguero to San José on a small plane, where we enjoyed spectacular aerial views of Irazú, Turrialba, Barva, and Poás Volcanoes. After breakfast, we drove along the Pan-American Highway toward Dota, enjoying beautiful mountain landscapes and stunning views

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throughout the journey. In Dota, we visited a lovely hummingbird garden before enjoying a delicious lunch. Later, we explored the cloud forest on a hike where we spotted the magnificent resplendent quetzal along with other beautiful birds such as the large-footed finch, collared redstart, and fiery-throated hummingbird. The day ended with a wonderful dinner and relaxing evening at Trogon Lodge.

Thursday 30 April 2026

Day 6:
Savegre Valley

We started the day with an early walk through the chilly cloud forest around San Gerardo de Dota, where we were lucky to spot the beautiful resplendent quetzal once again among the trees. The peaceful morning and fresh mountain air made for a wonderful start to the day. At lunchtime, we visited Miriam's Quetzals, a small local restaurant with excellent bird feeders. There we enjoyed amazing views of emerald toucanet, flame-colored tanager, acorn woodpecker, and several hummingbirds including the Talamanca hummingbird, volcano hummingbird, white-throated mountain-gem, fiery-throated hummingbird, and lesser violetear. Later, we enjoyed a relaxing hike along a local trail beside the beautiful Savegre River.

Friday 1 May 2026

Day 7:
Arriving to the Osa Peninsula

Today we travelled from Dota to the incredible Osa Peninsula. Along the way, we enjoyed beautiful views of the Pacific coast and the stunning Golfo Dulce. During a delicious local lunch, we observed several colourful birds including the crested guan, tropical kingbird, scarlet-rumped cacique, and scarlet-rumped tanager. At night, we went on an exciting walk through the rainforest, where the highlights included the colourful red-eyed tree frog, observing milk frog reproduction, as well as sightings of the Morelet's tree frog and the beautiful yellow-flecked cascade glass frog. The sounds and wildlife of the tropical forest made for a truly unforgettable evening.

Saturday 2 May 2026

Day 8:
Corcovado Los Patos

After breakfast, we hopped onto the wagon behind the tractor and birded along the way to the station, spotting species such as the vibrant scarlet macaw, Amazon kingfisher, and white ibis. With box lunches packed, we continued to the station surrounded by the incredible scenery of the Osa Peninsula. We enjoyed a short walk through the rainforest where we had excellent views of playful spider monkeys. On our way back, one of the highlights was spotting a fascinating Neotropical bird-eating snake hidden along the trail; By the end of the day, we saw 55 different species of birds. After an exciting day in the forest, we returned to the lodge to enjoy a relaxing dinner.

Sunday 3 May 2026

Day 9:
Golfo Dulce Osa Peninsula

After breakfast, we drove to Playa Blanca to explore the beautiful Golfo Dulce aboard a private boat. Early in the trip, we encountered a group of bottlenose dolphins, but the energetic pantropical spotted dolphin truly stole the show, jumping and swimming alongside the boat for nearly 40 minutes while everyone enjoyed taking photos. After a refreshing fruit break, the group had time to swim in the calm tropical waters of the gulf. Back at the hotel in the afternoon, we went for a relaxing walk around the property and spotted several wonderful wildlife species including the Hoffmann's two-toed sloth, grey-headed

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chachalaca, yellow-throated toucan, and the colourful endemic fiery-billed aracari.

Monday 4 May 2026

Day 10:

Back to San José

On our last day, some of us enjoyed a final morning of birding before departing back to San José. The sunny weather gave us spectacular views of the vast Térraba-Sierpe Wetlands, the largest wetland system in Central America, as well as the famous whale tail formation of Marino Ballena National Park along the Pacific coast. Back at Hotel Bougainvillaea, we spent the rest of the day relaxing and enjoying the beautiful gardens. During our walk, we spotted a mottled owl, rufous-tailed hummingbird, and the colourful Lesson's motmot. The journey ended with a wonderful final dinner together, sharing memories from an unforgettable adventure through Costa Rica.
